

SSH, Manabi no Waza, and Jiyu Kenkyu presentations (exhibition and presentation of posters)

Independent Research (Jiyu Kenkyu) at Tamagawa Academy is a learning activity based on the philosophy of “Jigaku Jiritsu” (Self-directed Learning and Independence). Students explore a research theme of their choice that aligns with their personal interests.



Each student selects a topic from one of five categories:

- 1 Human Sciences – History, Literature
- 2 Social Sciences – Economics, International Affairs
- 3 Natural Sciences – Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Mathematics
- 4 Health & Lifestyle – Human Body Structure, Health
- 5 Arts – Music, Art, Film, Three-Dimensional Art

This research spans three years, from Grade 10 to Grade 12, and culminates as a senior project.

Presentations by Grade 10 and 11 students will be exhibited in the exhibition room on the 3rd floor. Additionally, Grade 9 and 11 students will conduct poster presentations showcasing their research findings from the past one to two years.







Students learn the basic knowledge and application of numbers on computers, such as binary and octal numbers. Throughout the year, they also learned how to create and edit videos, and they will present their work.

Planning and patience are essential in the process of reaching completion. Do they appear in the calligraphy? Students will present their work.

Students explore the significance of sports in present-day society by addressing their questions with supporting evidence. Their presentations are structured into three parts: motive, question, and conclusion. They will present their findings using slides.

209 Cooking


Presentation time : 3/7 12:00 PM 3/8 10:00 AM

210 Handicraft

Presentation time : 3/7 12:30 PM 3/8 9:45 AM & 12:45 PM

There will be an exhibition of Sashiko, a traditional Japanese embroidery technique created by students. Additionally, students will present reports on handicrafts or showcase their own works.



301 G9 Community Project

In community project, they identified various needs in the local community and provided students with opportunities to address them through service activities. They worked in small groups to explore sustainable service initiatives that benefit the local community.

302 G10 Personal Project

This project is the culmination of the MYP, where students explore their areas of interest in an academic environment. They set their own success criteria and independently carry out their research, planning, actions, and reflections.

303 G11 Theory of Knowledge

The TOK exhibition is a required component of the DP core. Students choose three objects to explain their connection to TOK concepts and the real world.

304 G12 DP Core CAS,TOK, EE

Grade 12 DP students will give presentations on three subjects included in the DP core. Some students will explain their TOK Essay and Extended Essay, focusing on the process or outcomes. Others will present on CAS, sharing their experiences and the process of their projects.


In social studies, students choose a theme from geography, history, or civics and present their findings

Students will present their research on music and exhibit the scores they composed. They will also perform individually on their chosen musical instrument, selecting from wind, string, percussion instruments, or piano.



401 IB TAP

Presentation time : 3/7 9:20 AM 3/8 9:20 AM

Students learn leadership and followership through activities held in TAP, referred to as “well-rounded education in Action.” Each student researches an issue and considers possible solutions.

402 IB Science

Presentation time : 3/8 9:10 AM

IB MYP students begin projects that serve as models of ATL (Approaches to Learning). They demonstrate critical and creative thinking, research skills, and collaboration skills. Students are preparing presentations with a focus on practical experiments and critical analysis.

402 IB Data Science **Presentation time : 3/8 1:40 PM**

Data science is the study of extracting beneficial information from data. It involves discovering useful insights for business, science, and society through methods such as statistics and data analysis. Students formulate hypotheses based on their interests and justify them using data.

402 IB SDGs

Students had an opportunity to explore the SDGs in an academic environment. They researched issues related to their goals and independently investigated, planned, acted, and reflected, following the MYP design cycle.

402 IB French Language and Culture

Presentation time : 3/8 11:00 AM

Students learned about the language and culture of France this year. They made crêpes and explored French vocabulary, food, fashion, and sightseeing spots. You can enjoy the fascinating language and culture of France just as they experienced it.

403 IB Pi-rates/Math studies

Presentation time : 3/7 9:10 AM 3/8 9:00 AM, 10:30 AM

IB Math Enthusiasts(aka Pi-rates) is an independent study program for students who want to engage in various activities that explore mathematics outside the classroom. Over the past year, students have developed their critical thinking and problem-solving skills by challenging themselves with a range of math problems, from logic puzzles to complex written exercises. They have also applied the MYP Design Cycle to projects that explore real-world applications of mathematics.

403 IB Chinese Language and culture

Presentation time : 3/8 10:00 AM

Students learned Chinese through textbook exercises, videos and songs, and gained a deeper understanding of Chinese culture through these activities. For example, they made Chinese painting masks and Chinese patterned moon cakes (paper clay) for the Mid-Autumn Festival. We were also able to see and drink Chinese and Japanese tea ceremonies. The presentation is based on their own activities and interests in Chinese culture.

403 IB Japanese Language and culture

Presentation time : 3/8 10:30 AM

Japanese Culture & Language is a free study program to deepen understanding of Japanese culture and language through a variety of experiences. 2024 included koinobori art with stamps, Senryu, summer greeting, easy Japanese and disaster prevention, creative kanji, Japanese sweets made with clay, Chinese and Japanese tea, and making shimenawa decorations. Sometimes, they worked together with Chinese Language & Culture to learn and compare cultures. They will present the results of these activities.

404 IB Creative Performance

Presentation time : 3/8 9:00 AM

Each student set their own goals and worked on creating a video project from the ground up. They will present their final works along with the production process, summarizing their research on camera techniques and methods of expression.

404 IB Music

Performance announcement : 3/8 10:00 AM (music room1)

The students have set music as their theme, and have studied and analyzed performance techniques and musical compositions. Each student will present the results of their research in a slide show and individual presentation of practical skills. Some of the students are playing instruments for the first time! Please look forward to their performances!

405 IB MUN

Presentation time : 3/8 10:30 AM

Students learned about the procedures of the United Nations Commission. Students chose a country to represent, researched facts about that country, and understood who they were representing. They then researched their country's political and economic policies as they related to the topic, prepared position papers for each country, and prepared opening speeches. In committee meetings, delegations proposed and discussed solutions to the negative effects of fast fashion. In addition, students participated in the Junior MUN Conference, where they worked with students from other schools to find solutions to global problems.

405 IB Rosaku/Farming

Students grew many vegetables through planning and research on how to grow them. While facing the challenges of outdoor weather, soil preparation, and pest control, the students were able to develop their research, thinking, and social skills.

406 IB Hand Craft


Presentation time : 3/8 10:00 AM

In Hand Craft, students chose research theme, and then researched the necessary materials, tools, production methods, and history, and compiled them into a slide presentation. They also worked for a year to create their works with the goal of exhibiting them at this Pegasus Festival. They also experienced growing indigo plants, dyeing them, and harvesting the seeds. They will exhibit their works and give a slide presentation.

This year students learned the basic rules of photography and videography. They learned how to frame a subject, how different shots create a visual narrative, how to make a short film, and much more!



ATC303·ATC3F hallway 2D art


Presentation time : 3/7 12:00 PM 3/8 9:30 AM

Students will present their findings from research activities, transplant activities, training, and breeding activities. You can see the coral breeding tank and the coral egg tank.




Students have been improving their robots for many months. They will present the well-controlled movements of their robots. Please look forward to controlling a robot yourself!




Students explore and experiment with themes that interest them. Research findings, such as superconductivity and the principles of batteries, will be exhibited.
